PASTOR'S DESK

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

I'm pretty sure you are wondering the same thing I am – where did the time go since Christmas? How can we be staring into the face of Hurricane Season again?! As June begins, so does THAT season. It can cause us to panic a bit, just remembering all that happened with Hurricane Ian is enough to make us want to hide our heads in the sand. Instead, let's think about what Jesus might have us do. He acts like one of those volunteer rescue workers who didn't have to come out and help others get to safety or clean up their homes, but he did anyway. Think about the way Jesus helped the woman caught in adultery out of the mess she in, showing the men who wanted to stone her to death that maybe they weren't any better than she was because they had sinned, too. What about how Jesus showed the expert in the law that sometimes its people like a Samaritan who will stop and help people in trouble rather than the leaders of the Jews, who hated the Samaritans. What has he shown us this year? Even though we are a small church, when we volunteered to join together with all the churches of STREAM we accomplished big things for our community in Affordable Housing and Criminal Justice. He showed us that we could give significant assistance to families without a home so their elementary school kids would have what they needed to start school. He even taught us that it's never too late to have a big impact on others' lives as we heard from David Blinn when he shared about the Healing River ministry that God helped him start in Kenya. We are more powerful than we know when we let God lead us to help make things better for others. It's a privilege to be here at Emmanuel for another year so we can continue to push the limits of what anyone else might have thought we could do.

We have work to do friends and I hope some of you who aren't involved with a ministry yet are willing to find your place to help. Perhaps you want to help in one of these existing places but I hope some of you will be excited about these:

- A craft fair on our campus in November so we can bring more people on our campus and perhaps even into our doors to worship with us. I really need a couple people to take the lead in the planning and execution of this event. Food truck, anyone?
- 2. Need a smaller option? I need two people to help us get a new Church Directory that has all the updated information we like to have. This takes a good bit of preparation but once the picture days come in March, it will be smooth sailing.
- 3. What about sitting down to eat a meal together again? With someone to cook a meal or each of us bringing our favorite dish, we could invite friends and neighbors to join us. Anyone willing to help us figure this one out? I want to talk to you!

These are just a few of the things we would like to start again now that the pandemic is mostly over. While we may be older, we are wiser and definitely have plenty of life left. Think about how we can all work together in the same direction. Jesus has shown us already what we can accomplish when we follow him!

2023 Sales Tax HolidayDISASTER PREPAREDNESS SALES TAX HOLIDAY (two holidays)



May 27 - June 9, 2023 and August 26 - September 8, 2023 Exempt items are:

- A portable self-powered light source selling for \$40 or less;
- A portable self-powered radio, two-way radio, or weather-band radio selling for \$50 or less;
- A tarpaulin or other flexible waterproof sheeting selling for \$100 or less;
- An item normally sold as, or generally advertised as, a ground anchor system or tie-down kit selling for \$100 or less;
- A gas or diesel fuel tank selling for \$50 or less;
- A package of AA-cell, AAA-cell, C-cell, D-cell, 6-volt, or 9-volt batteries, excluding automobile and boat batteries, selling for \$50 or less;
- A nonelectric food storage cooler selling for \$60 or less;
- A portable generator used to provide light or communications or preserve food in the event of a power outage selling for \$3,000 or less;
- Reusable ice selling for \$20 or less;
- A portable power bank selling for \$60 or less;
- A smoke detector or smoke alarm selling for \$70 or less;
 A fire extinguisher selling for \$70 or less;
- A carbon monoxide detector selling for \$70 or less; and
- Supplies necessary for the evacuation of household pets. Necessary supplies are the noncommercial purchase of:
 - Bags of dry dog or cat food weighing 50 or fewer pounds with a sales price of \$100 or less per bag;
 - Cans or pouches of wet dog or cat food selling for \$10 or less per can or pouch or the equivalent if sold in a box or case;
 - Over-the-counter pet medications selling for \$100 or less;
 - Portable kennels or pet carriers selling for \$100 or less;
 - Manual can openers selling for \$15 or less;
 - Leashes, collars, and muzzles selling for \$20 or less;
 - Collapsible or travel-size food or water bowls selling for \$15 or less;
 - Cat litter weighing 25 or fewer pounds and selling for \$25 or less;
 - Cat litter pans selling for \$15 or less; o Pet waste disposal bags selling for \$15 or less;
 - o Pet pads selling for \$20 or less per box; o Hamster or rabbit substrate selling for \$15 or less; and
 - Pet beds selling for \$40 or less.
- Common household consumable items selling for \$30 or less.
 - The following laundry detergent and supplies: powder, liquid, or pod detergent, fabric softener, dryer sheets, stain removers, and bleach;
 - Toilet paper;
 - Paper towels;
 - Paper napkins and tissues;
 - Facial tissues;
 - Hand soap, bar soap and body wash;
 - Sunscreen and sunblock;
 - Dish soap and detergents, including powder, liquid, or pod detergents or rinse agents that can be used in dishwashers;
 - Cleaning or disinfecting wipes and sprays;
 - Hand sanitizer; and
 - o Trash bags.
